

# Penn Forest Twp. Garbage account shortage investigated; prevention measures adopted

by Seth Isenberg A small crowd at Penn Forest Township supervisors April 4 meeting was rewarded by a short business-filled meeting, and a thorough discussion of the garbage account. Winning bidder Custom

Contracting was planning to start work on Phase II of the township park, weather permitting, on April 11. Supervisors' chairman Butch Reiner reports that the detention basin at the park that doesn't perc will be dug up and fixed, using township crews and equipment.

A motion was made for the trade-in of two township trucks and the purchase of a new one, with \$25,038 in trade-in proceeds, and approved 4-0. Supervisor Judy Knappenberger was absent.

The Park & Recreation Board met for its first meeting in 2016, reorganized, and got down to business, shared supervisor Phil Shedaker. They had "a very good meeting," with good ideas. Their second meeting was April 18, and next on May 16. The board is trying to get heads of the area's sporting organizations to attend so that it can plan for 2017.

The park itself is open again for the year, as of April 4.

Supervisors, having had no response to calls to the Jim Thorpe School District about the representative they are supposed to send to the Park & Recreation Board, will send a letter drafted by township solicitor Tom Nanovic insisting they send someone.

# Paws for Pet Emergency Response

Carbon County Animal Response Team had Kidder Township supervisors pause to consider intriguing pet emergency response options during the March 17 meeting. Pets could soon breath a bit easier as plans to approach area fire companies including Lake Harmony and Albrightsville with pet oxygen masks and training are in the works.

Since 2004, Pennsylvania State Animal Response Teams across the common-



wealth have assisted in rescuing furry friends and livestock in emergency situations such as fires, flooding and vehicle accidents. Prompted by primary responders, these trained volunteers are deployed by 9-1-1 control centers with equipment used to extract, as well as directives from veterinarians to treat or transport animals.

"We would like never to have to respond," PSART Executive Director Joel Hersh later commented emphasizing the


importance of preparation in emergency situations.

"Small domestic animals to large livestock are part of your family," he said, adding, "You should be prepared for emergencies."

Attorney Nanovic also read into the record a statement explaining actions about actions that shorted the township of \$1,625 from garbage bills. When discovered, staff found 38 garbage accounts that had been made inactive. or had voided bills-totaling the above figure. Solicitor Nanovic was directed to contact PA State Police, and they started an investigation. The result of that investigation is that PSP and the Carbon County District Attorney's Office "determined there was not sufficient evidence to bring criminal charges against any person."

Nanovic's statements notes "disappointment" with this outcome, but satisfaction that both the PSP and County D.A.'s office did everything they could to help in recovering this money and holding those responsible to account. The person(s) who are suspected of doing this is/are no longer working for the township. Without additional information, the matter will be closed.

It was also noted that the township's insurance has a higher deductible than the loss, so there was no help there.

Nanovic ended by stating that systems are in place to deter this from happening-and to identify the person responsible if it does. In

addition to passwords and individual I.D.s for system users, a new policy is in place that no garbage account can

be made inactive and no invoice voided without an explanation as to why. He thanked the office staff for their quick work once the problem was identified — especially with all the checking of all the accounts to find the total unaccounted for. He also thanked State Police and the DA's staff for their help in this matter.

Code officer Kathryn Forry presented her report, showing busier permit activity in March. She issued 28 zoning, 10 building and 5 sewer permits; 17 zoning certificates of occupancy plus 12 for buildings. There were 41 zoning, 41 UCC and 27 septic inspections. There is also one new zoning complaint to investigate. Forry also reported that the property at 127 North Shore Drive in Indian Mountain that suffered a fire is now cleaned up "and in good repair." Supervisors voted 4-0 to refund fire escrow funds of \$10,720.

There were 12 right-toknow requests filled in March, and 23 zoning and septic info requests taken care of.

The long process of organizing electronics recycling was rewarded with a contract to host an event on Saturday, July 16, at the Transfer Station. The township will provide extra staff to direct traffic that day. The Transfer Station brought in \$679 in bulk items in March. Garbage permits sold total \$244,144 for '15-'16.

Members of Towamensing Trails, Beltzville Lake Estates, and Indian Mountain Lake all were approved for exemptions to the township's garbage permit fees, since these associations handle garbage on their own.

Treasurer Tammy Mcreport Mahon's showed \$2,476,706 in the township's general fund, \$719,277 in sanitation, \$311,790 in Liguid Fuels, \$244,152 in septic, \$134,346 in capital reserve, \$30,630 in payroll, \$9,209 in SALDO, plus \$2,083,860 in Parks & Recreation, for a total of \$6,009,970. There's \$1.030.591 in the PLGIT and \$308,066 in the JTNB CDs. Supervisors approved the treasurer's report.



March's bills were \$75,620 from the general fund. \$30,000 was paid to Penn Forest VFC#2. Bills of note are quarterly payments to the two Penn Forest Township Volunteer Fire Companies of \$13,750 each, \$10,720 as a release of fire escrow funds. payroll liabilities to the U.S. Treasury totaled \$2,662 and \$2,607 and \$2,160, a total of \$5,432 for four bills to Barry Isett & Assoc. (BIA) for engineering and professional services, \$4,620 to Pine Ridge Services for winter roads maintenance. \$4.088 to Nanovic Law Offices, \$3,907 to the PA Workers Insurance Fund, EIT commission to Berkheimer of \$2,384, \$1,796 to Carbon County for 911 services. \$1.702 for staff's health and vision insurance to Highmark, \$1,047 to PPL for electric, \$1,000 to the Jim Thorpe Rotary Club for their 2016 summer recreation program, \$779 to WEX Bank for vehicle fuel, plus 20 other smaller bills.

BIA earned \$3,736 for professional work for the township park project from the Parks/Rec fund, and another \$1,276 in septic inspection work from that fund. From Sanitation. \$13.964 went to wages and \$1,702 to Highmark for health and vision, \$11,597 was paid to Waste Management for garbage Please turn to page 5

hauling, of a total of \$28,588.

American Rock Salt was paid \$8.288 for loads of salt. the Ford CF-8000 needed \$4,011 in repairs on its lift cylinder, and there were \$1,6019 in repairs to the other two township trucks - all paid to

Kovatch Ford. Wyoming Electric was called to service the traffic lights - they were stuck - for \$620. Locust Ridge Quarry sent a load of anti-skid, for \$408. These were drawn from the Liquid Fuels fund.

Press members, supervisors Reiner, Shedaker, and four staff far outnumbered the seven citizens who took the time to attend. The next regular meeting of Penn Forest supervisors is Monday. May 2 at 6 p.m. for the work session, with the regular meeting to follow at 7 p.m. at the township building on Route 903.




