Phase II Penn Forest park bidding documents ready

Penn Forest Township supervisors were given an explanation of the new township park phase II construction plans at their February 1 meeting. Township engineer Greg Pavlik showed that the huge cost of removing soils would be cut by 99%. The old plans had removal of 22,258 cubic yards of soil, while the new has just 279 yards to take away.

The park will still have the two baseball fields, the soccer/football field and the small soccer field built, but will cut back from three basketball courts to two, and two tennis courts to one. Room will be left to build those later. All construction will be using the lower gate, so as to not disturb regular park users. There will be a construction fence erected.

Bid packages are available online and at the township. Bids are due to the township by March 7 so that they can be opened that night at the March supervisors meeting. Plans are that with acceptable

bids, work on phase II would begin as early as April 1, and be done some time in August. Pavlik hopes to have at least one growing season this year for the grass. Supervisors voted to advertise the bids in more places including in this newspaper and its sisters, *The Journal-Herald* and *Journal of the Pocono Plateau*.

Allison Carter of Behrens Road thanked supervisors for their action to make the dangerous road safer. Roadmaster and supervisors' chairman Butch Reiner shared that the

township has asked PPL to install two lights on the curve - which should be installed by month's end. There will also be signs with arrows on the approaches to the curve, plus more speed limit signs. Guide rails are not in the plans.

Treasurer Tammy McMahon's report was read. It shows \$2,348,944 in the general fund, \$735,173 in sanitation, \$241,869 in septic, \$164,291 in capital reserve, \$86,222 in Liquid Fuels, \$14,632 in payroll, \$9,209 in SALDO, plus \$591,705 in Park/Recreation, for a total of \$4,192,046. There's \$2,529,552 in the PLGIT and \$308,065 in the JTNB CDs. Supervisors approved the treasurer's report. Supervisors then agreed to close the small PLGIT account that had been set up to receive direct payments for garbage, and put the balance of \$10,213 in the Sanitation Fund.

After that, they approved January bills of \$97,740 from the general fund. Bills of note are

Supervisors okayed permitting fire police from the township's fire companies to help with traffic control at the Black Bear Triathlon on er, in his report, said a State of Emergency in PA was declared during the big snowstorm in January, so the township will file forms to get some reimbursement of costs from FEMA. There were 18 right-toknow requests and 22 septic. escrow and perc requests in January.

In code officer Kathryn Forry's report on permit activity, issued were 6 zoning and 4 building permits, 30 zoning and 18 building certificates of occupancy. There were 25 zoning, and 46 UCC inspections, plus one zoning complaint to investigate. The Fiedor setback variance was okayed at a Jan. 7 zoning hearing board meeting.

Eleven citizens, four staff and two press joined supervisors Reiner, Knappenberger, Chris Fazio and Scott Lignore at this meeting. Phil Shedaker was absent.

The next meeting is Monday, March 7 at 6 p.m. for the work session, with the reqular meeting to follow at 7 p.m. at the township building on Route 903.

Letter to the Editor

Dear Editor,

Last week, PennDOT announced it was moving forward with plans to phase out vehicle registration stickers in lieu of "smart plate" automated license plate technology. PennDOT estimates that this changeover will save \$3.1 million.

While cost savings for PennDOT are very important, we must also discuss its impact on municipalities and local police departments. I'm concerned with the fact that, in order for law enforcement to utilize the "smart plate" technology, each police cruiser must be equipped with an \$18,000 plate reader.

This additional expense will place an undue burden on Pennsylvania police departments. There are over 1,200 police departments in Pennsylvania, and the majority have more than one cruiser. This will present a significant financial burden especially for those in rural areas.


PennDOT has expressed a willingness to offer grants to assist departments in purchasing of the new equipment. However, it is unrealistic to expect that the agency will be able to provide enough funds for all police departments. The projected savings from the elimination of registration stickers would not cover the cost of new equipment for all police cruisers.

I believe that this money would be better spent arming police forces with tools to combat the opioid epidemic and prevent overdose deaths.

Earlier this year, the House, in a bipartisan vote, passed House Bill 1154 which would repeal PennDOT's elimination of vehicle registration stickers. I am optimistic the Senate will pass House Bill 1154 and send it to the governor. This bill is supported by the Pennsylvania Fraternal Order of Police.

Cost savings must always be considered, but the implementation of PennDOT's plan, on its current schedule, is hasty and will have unintended consequences.



Kidder funds center, library

"It's a building we needed a use for," explained Thomas Bradley, responding to a question about Schoolhouse Central funding during the Kidder Township's February 18 meeting. Art classes, a drama club, and senior luncheons fill the community center's calendar and keep the building busy. Noting a \$250 donation is in the budget, supervisors approved the non-profit's request for support.

Supervisor Barbara Franzosa cited tax revenue Penn-Kidder Library Center provides as a result of use of computers for online job testing and applications. Reporting 400 new library

cards issued last year, board of trustees president Mary Farnschlader thanked supervisors for approving a \$1,000 contribution, adding that continuous fundraisers aid the volunteer run organization in subsidizing costs.

Supervisors advanced a lump sum of \$60,000 in response to Lake Harmony Rescue Squad's request for \$75,000, in anticipation of 2016 tax revenues coming in. The Rescue Squad needs the funds to meet payroll obligations after the department waived doing the annual subscription and membership program after the general election ballot question approving a .5 mill Ambulance Tax for the Lake Harmony Rescue Squad and Ambulance Corps, in order to maintain 24 hours a day, 7 days a week ambulance service

passed. "When the tax money comes in we take the \$60,000 back," said supervisor Thomas LaFond.

Investigating the fire at the Blakeslee Inn on February 3 that destroyed the local landmark, PA State Police Deputy Fire Marshal Corporal Shawn Hilbert, in coordination with the PMRPD and insurance company investigators, determined that the fire originated inside an interior wall in the corner of the restaurant office - with a cause as an electrical failure in a receptacle. The fire was called in at 8:25 a.m. after a fire alarm was activated. An employee on scene went back to check, and found smoke in the area of the kitchen and of-

fice. On exiting, fire was seen in the office. The fire spread into the ceiling and got into other portions of the building. Fire Companies from Monroe, Carbon, Luzerne and Lackawanna Counties turned out equipment and volunteers to aid the Tobyhanna Township Volunteer Fire Co. in fighting the blaze, and then to supply water tankers for the firefight. The Blakeslee Inn's restaurant and offices are a total loss. Motel units on both sides of that were saved. No one was injured during the fire.

Three people were arrested
