# Windmill worries continue for Penn Forest supervisors

If we could only harness the hot air for electricity, we could probably make quite a few bucks for Penn Forest Township. As it is, we've gone through another month of citizens speaking out at the township meeting, and later, citizens turning out at the continued zoning hearing. We really aren't much further along

in the decision process over the proposed wind farm at the edge of the Pocono Plateau in Penn Forest Township. The proposal erects 40 giant turbine units in a way that would tower over thousands of the township's homes.

Township supervisors can still only listen, the only decision that will be made at this phase is at the zoning hearing board or in court if any lawsuit gets filed against either the Bethlehem Water Authority or Bethlehem City Council. At the June regular supervisors'

Boy Scout Troop 555 recently added another Eagle to its nest. meeting on June 6, residents opposed to the wind farm were the primary speakers in the public portion of the meeting. The only non-wind-mill questioner was a resident seeking information on outdoor burning.

This meeting was the first for new supervisor Roger Meckes, who was appointed to fill Phil Shedaker's vacated seat.

In other business at the township meeting, bids were read for both paving Wargo Road, tar & chipping Meckesville Road, and line painting

throughout the township. For paving, Schiffer Bituminous of Kunkletown was lowest at \$67,065—about \$5,000 less than the next lowest. Schiffer was also lowest for the chipping of Meckesville Rd. at \$32,885—11% lower than the next bid. DeAngelo Broth-

ers/DBI of Hazleton, was low bidder for line painting at \$21,588, about 10% lower than the only other bidder. Both low bids were accepted, with work to begin shortly. Roadmaster and supervisors chairman Butch Reiner report that the township crew is out working to cut back brush from shoulders of township roads. They are short one employee.

The treasurer's report shows a total of \$1,021,034 in the PLGIT money market fund, \$6,007,450 in Mauch Chunk Trust in the various funds, and \$308,066 in CDs at the Jim Thorpe Neighborhood Bank. The annual audit report ad was run in the daily newspaper with a condensed financial statement.

Supervisors paid the first two payments on the township park work, \$233,892 and \$105,930, to contractor Custom Contracting. The work is going along well.

Total garbage permits sold for the '15-'16 year is \$247,239. The '16-'17 year has started, with a total of \$75,325 in permits sold. The Transfer Station also reports earning an extra \$526 from bulk items in May.

In Right-To-Know, there were 33 new requests, and 39 new requests were made. There were also 19 requests for zoning and septic info.

For zoning officer Kathryn Forry, it was also a busy May. She issued 39 zoning permits, 17 for building including 4 for new homes, and 7 septic permits. She also issued certificate of occupancies — 8 for zoning, and 10 for buildings. Her team inspected 37 for zoning, 45 buildings for UCC, and 39 septics. There was a zoning complaint, two follow-ups, and a hearing for a setback (approved). She was present for the special exception hearing for Atlantic Wind in May, and at the June 23 continuance.

Supervisors unanimously approved the combining of two lots in Hickory Run Forest for the Mastrandrea family.

# Windmill zoning hearing packed, continued again

On June 23, citizens packed the Whispering Pines Hall at PFTVC#1 to overflowing for the continuing Zoning Hearing Board meeting on a special exception application to allow for nearly 40 wind turbines to be built on the top of Bethlehem Water Authority land in Penn Forest Township. In addition to the full house, there were people picketing against the project who remained outside.

Attendees inside the hall were treated to nearly three

hours of very technical discussion that began to show the battle lines over the Atlantic Wind project. Attorneys have been hired to protect the interests of Penn Forest Township property owners. These professionals are going to be taking on

the attorneys representing the multi-national Iberdrola Renewables wind turbine company, and likely soon the Bethlehem Water Authority.

Representing several of the locals was Atty. Bruce Anders. He questioned Iberdrola's explanations of its planned actions, noting they are potentially misleading.

Philip Malitsch, who has property abutting the affected area, brought along Atty. Theodore Lewis. Malitsch is a civil engineer, and he and Atty. Lewis went through the lease and memorandum/agreement between Iberdrola Renewables and Bethlehem Water Authority (BWA), concluding there is a "fatal flaw" in it—so

not in compliance with Penn Forest's ordinance. Malitsch then produced a letter from BWA that was written opposing the recent application of PennEast to build a pipeline through their property. In the letter, BWA complains to the federal authorities about runoff, deforestation, and "forest fragmentation" from the pipeline construction.

At this point, time ran out for the meeting, and it was continued.

The important thing is there was a good turnout, and for that turnout to continue or grow. The hearing continues on Thursday, July 14, again at the Whispering Pines hall starting at 7 p.m.



# Heffly talks turbines

County's State Representative Doyle Heffley was interviewed about the proposed Iberdrola Renewables wind farm on Bethlehem Water Authority land in Penn Forest Township. The project, valued at about \$160 million, is to place electric generating windmills atop the edge of the ridge on BWA's conserved watershed property.

Rep. Heffley's opinion is that BWA "shouldn't be putting windmills [in this community]...[they] need to be a better neighbor." They don't pay taxes, he notes, adding their job is to provide quality clean drinking water to their community.

"We don't have a shortage of electricity in Pennsylvania," and in off-peak hours, some PA utilities need to dump electricity because there's not demand for it. This project "requires a large federal subsidy" to generate affordable energy. Without federal tax dollars, they could not be affordably built.

He points out windmill construction will damage the land that protects the watershed, put an "industrial activity" atop the resort/residential areas in Penn Forest Township, and is unneeded. The BWA contracted with Iberdrola to "make money." This project "has nothing to do" with delivery of water.

He agreed with this reporter that if the BWA would build hydro-electric plants at their dams and along their feeder lines, that would be a better answer.

Rep. Heffley noted that the ridgeline is the habitat for the endangered northern long-eared bat. Look for an interview with local conservationists in an upcoming *Journal*.

# Parking lot paving planned for Kidder Township

Kidder Township supervisors are ready to provide additional parking for people attending meetings at the township building. At the supervisors' meeting on June 16, seven bids were opened for paving a new section of the lot. Bruce George Paving and Excavating of Kunkletown was the apparent low bidder at \$86,075.72. Provided the bid passes legal review, supervisors awarded the job to the low bidder.

Two subdivision/land development projects were reviewed. A two year extension

of LDIA to July 20, 2018 was granted for Mid Lake II-Boulder Lake Village. Jack Frost Golf Course PRD, Phase I, was granted a two year extension for final plan submission, also to July 20, 2018.

Supervisors adopted ordinance 177, requiring the registration of all automatic fire alarms.

A bid proposal of \$7,500 was received for an emergency services planning report from VFIS.

Philip Sheadaker's resignation as part-time patrolman was accepted; he has been hired full-time somewhere else. Ellen Matt resigned from the Planning commission. Anyone interested in filling the remainder of her term, which would expire December 31, 2017, should send a letter to township business manager Lisa Klem.

Klem reported that she

had obtained quotes for repairs to the roof of the police station, which is leaking The low price came from D'Angola Construction, for \$5,735 to replace the roof. Supervisors gave the go-ahead for the job.

PennDOT has agreed to help the township with storm

drainage work on South Lake Road. Supervisors Barb Franzosa and Bruce Berger met on that and other road issues. Lake Harmony Estated in planning a retention basin to ease drainage issues there. Paving was planned for part




