

With overwhelming support from the community, installations of historical roadside markers started on Thursday, July 11 at 11 a.m. in Tobyhanna Township with the unveiling of the historical marker, **Summer Youth Camps**. It was donated by the Kitchen-Diener Family, in honor of Dr. James G. and Martha Kitchen, who provided medical care to thousands of campers over the years.

The location of this historical marker is at the Blanche D. Price Park and township government center just off of State Street in Pocono Pines. The unveiling ceremony was held with the donor's family, MATT volunteers and township officials slated to attend. The public is encouraged to attend all marker unveilings.

The historical roadside marker project began last summer when a group of vol-

"I just got the keys today," beamed Tim Lee, program director for Pocono Services for Families and Children Monroe County Head Start, as representatives from several other area agencies toured their soon-to-be home inside the new Mountain Community Education and Service Center on July 1.

As the ink dries on PSFC's \$3.1 million purchase from Pocono Mountain School District, the group including Monroe County Area Agency on

Aging, United Way, Pocono Alliance, RHD Crossroads, and Street to Feet, converged on the former Coolbaugh Ele-

mentary Center, vacant since 2012.

Budget sent to Governor after bipartisan passage

On June 30, Rep. Rosemary M. Brown (R-Monroe/Pike), David Parker (R-Monroe), and Jack Rader (R-Monroe) voted in favor of Senate Bill 1073, the final state budget plan for fiscal year 2016-17.

This budget again received bipartisan support in the House, and contains no new or broad-based tax increases to Pennsylvania taxpayers. After the vote, the delegation made the following statement:

Today, as we have sent this budget to the governor for his final approval, we are thankful he agreed to take broad-based tax hikes off the table for this year's budget negotiations. Taxpayers and businesses across Monroe and Pike counties have told us repeatedly that they cannot afford to pay higher sales or income taxes, especially with the high rate of property taxes in our area. The House spent nine months of last fiscal year

standing up for our taxpayers, and fighting against additional taxes."

This budget spends \$665 million in new funding for pre-K to 12th grade, which includes a \$200 million increase in basic education funding. This funding will be distributed through the new, fairer funding formula, which will benefit our local schools."

This year, while we are glad that there are no new or increased taxes for households, we are disappointed that there is no mention of property tax reform. We have stood united in being against broad-based tax increases without a direct reduction in property tax rates. We will continue to fight for property tax reform and how we collect money to fund our schools based on the value of our homes, as these remain the most stressing issues to our local people."

We are glad the General Assembly was able to pass this budget on time, but looking forward, we

hope budgets can be crafted based on needs, as opposed to the assumption that taxpayers are expected

to pay more year after year

unteers in Tobyhanna Township began seeking donations for the community-wide project. To date, 25 markers have been paid for through donations.

Installations were started last fall, with the marker entitled **Salem United Church of Christ**. Organized as MATT, the Marker Advisors of Tobyhanna Township, the group hopes to have all markers installed before the ground freezes next fall. The marker installation schedule can be viewed on the marker website, or by calling MATT at 570-580-5353.

Unveiled on June 18 was the marker **Tobyhanna Town-**

ship, which provides a history of the community's formation and early years. Donated by the Pocono Lions Club, its location is the park and flag pole area along Route 940 in Pocono Pines near the traffic light.

In the coming weeks, installation is planned for markers entitled **Lutherland, Wagner's Tree Farm, Lumbering, Blakeslee United Methodist Church, and The Battle of Locust Ridge**. These will be followed by **Naomi Pines House, Sullivan Bridge, The Stagecoach Inn, William Henry Christman** and **Jacob Blakeslee, Jr.** During the fall many more will be installed.

Upon installation of all markers, a driving tour map will be made available. In the meantime, installed marker

locations can be viewed on the marker website at <http://www.tobyhannatwp.history.org/markers.html>. Each marker website page has considerably more information and photographs documenting the historical topics. And when visiting each marker's physical location, viewers can scan into a smartphone a decal mounted to the marker pole. This will take the visitor directly to that marker's website page, with access to view information about all other markers.

According to MATT, there are still a few significant historical topics available for marker donations. Interested parties can visit the website and call MATT at 570-580-5353.

Barriers make I-80 safer

Another deadly crash on Interstate 80 reminds us that the road could be a LOT safer for regular users.

What we know is that at about 6 a.m. on June 28, a driver of a car with New Jersey plates heading west lost control and drove his car off the road. The car went through the median and ended up going westbound in the eastbound lanes, facing heavy traffic. His car hit/was hit by a tractor-trailer, and he was thrown from the car and died.

That the driver could drive through the median and onto the oncoming lanes is a HUGE concern. This could have been much worse.

We urge PennDOT to put barriers in place in these medians to give out-of-control vehicles a life-saving stop, and to keep opposing traffic from the chance this will happen again.

shared plans with sections dedicated to Early Childhood Development, as well as multigenerational programs.

Calling the acquisition a "collective impact approach," Lee explained benefits of bringing community resources up the mountain. With a majority of agencies situated in Stroudsburg, reaching these

Monroe County residents was a struggle, as many had difficulty traveling downtown. While alleviating the distance dilemma was pivotal, opening doors to regional and national funding under joint grant writing initiatives proved to be key. PSFC's vision of serving infants through seniors at this facility had Monroe County Area Agency on Aging senior center manager Leslie Berger agreeing the more accessible location off Route 611 and close to I-380 will "reach clearly more people" no matter what the age.

With sites across the county as far as West End, the elder organization offering recreational programs focuses on "The big three"—socialization, wellness and nutrition. It's considering future ideas for both the young and not-as-young participants, including an outdoor community classroom and community garden, an innovative approach to embracing their new surroundings.

As the outlook is optimistic for Head Start classes in the new location by the end of August, the opportunity for an expanding collection of community agencies increases with many eager to settle in soon.

PMC using robot to fight infections

In an effort to proactively address the issue of hospital-acquired infections and to bolster its existing strong commitment to patient safety, Pocono Medical Center has invested in a germ-eliminating robot called Tru-D SmartUVC.

"Pocono Medical Center is dedicated to providing the safest hospital environment possible through the adoption of cutting-edge technologies and protocols," said Dr. William Cors, Vice President and Chief Medical Officer at Pocono Medical Center. "Tru-D technology takes an extra step toward hospital-acquired infection prevention while providing confidence for both our patients and staff that we are committed to their safety."

Tru-D provides enhanced terminal room disinfection through the use of UVC light energy. After environmental services staff cleans a room using traditional methods, Tru-D is brought in to complete the disinfection process. The 5-foot-5 robot operates from a single position and administers a single cycle of UV light, killing up to 99.9% of C. diff, MRSA, MERS, Ebola and many other harmful pathogens. Short for "total room

ultraviolet disinfection," Tru-D takes the minimum time necessary to disinfect an entire room, including shadowed areas. Once the cleaning cycle is complete, Tru-D automatically shuts down and sends an audio and/or text message alert to the operator that disinfection is complete.

Leading researchers and infection preventionists have begun to stress the importance of the use of UV in terminal room cleaning strategies. At the recent APIC annual conference, Dr. William A. This distinction places Pocono Medical Center among the top 10 percent of hospitals in the nation for its excellent performance as evaluated by Healthgrades as well as among the top 10 percent of hospitals in Pennsylvania by U.S. News and World Report.

The pioneer in UV disinfection, Tru-D was the only device of its kind selected for the first-ever randomized, clinical trial on UVC disinfection because of its Sensor 360 technology that eliminates any chance of human error in the disinfection process. Osprey and peregrine falcons topic of Game Commission program

Two of Pennsylvania's most charismatic birds of prey will be subjects of a dual educational program presented by the Pennsylvania Game Commission.

Northeast Region Education and Information Supervisor William Williams and Wildlife Biologist Kevin Wener will be providing information on these two raptor species that suffered catastrophic population declines in Pennsylvania. Both are now on the road to recovery.

"Osprey and peregrine falcon populations in Pennsylvania were decimated by

the use of DDT decades ago and both remain on the state threatened and endangered list," explained Williams. "Their biology and behavior, population declines, reintroduction efforts, ongoing recovery, and current management will be discussed."

Over \$5 Million in grant funding for district projects

Police Beat by Seth Isenberg

This was a very busy week around the Pocono Plateau, with area police agencies submitting a thick sheaf of reports.

A Lehigh area man arrived at a 57 Road, Kunkletown property just before midnight on 7-5, PSP-L. There were also three reports of fights / fighting.

PSP investigated a report of indecent assault on children, 6-19.

There were nine reports of criminal mischief/ vandalisms over the last month in the PSP-L coverage area.


