Library offers a Cool READtreat

As summer's heat sizzles Pocono Mountain Public Library director Anne Shincovich shared an invitation to settle in for some air-conditioned options during the Coolbaugh Township meeting on July 19. Reporting over 4,170 visits in June with 106 new patron cards issued and

nearly 150 kids registered for the summer reading program, she noted the "cool" idea is spreading.

Adding libraries throughout the county are sites for the Pokemon Go craze, they also provide indoor amenities including WiFi and family friendly programs, along with of course -- books!

PMSD shares the view

Eyes squinting are a thing of the past as Pocono Mountain School District opens wide angle opportunities to share stats on the school district starting with the July 20 school board meeting. Acknowledging the Swiftwater Administrative Office campus as a hubspot for training and presentations, directors applauded administration and IT for seeing the potential of new screen technology.

James Lynch of D'Huy Engineering took attention outdoors, dishing the dirt on district fields as East and West High School turf time nears.

Reviewing massive stone removal with photos chronologically illustrating progress at the athletic fields, he reported dates for completion are o track for soon after students get back, with both "substantial" completions the first week of September.

"It was a surprise this year," said business manager Joe Colozza as the board reopened and then approved the 2016-2017 budget. An increase of \$1.7 million in Basic Education State Subsidies, combined with adjustments to expenses, resulted in an addition of \$70,000 to the district

the last decade the center became underutilized, and fell into disrepair.

In 2009 a reorganization was undertaken, and a new board was elected. Over the last seven years the board has worked to bring the center back into the focus of the Blakeslee Community, as well as to update the building.

The history of Tobyhanna Township was unveiled on July 18 when the Historical Roadside Marker, "Tobyhanna Township" was dedicated. The Pocono Lions Club donated this historical marker, with the volunteers of the Marker Advocates of Tobyhanna Township coordinating the dedication event.

This historical marker is located at the Lions' flagpole park in Pocono Pines, near the traffic light at the intersection of Route 940 and Route

423. The marker traces the history of Tobyhanna Township since it was founded in 1830.

Additional historical information can be viewed on MATT's website at www.toby-hannatwphistory.org/markers. There, other roadside markers can be viewed, along with information about the entire program.

In addition to members of the Pocono Lions Club, PA State Representative Jack Rader and the Board of Supervisors of Tobyhanna Township attended the dedication.

Addressing the attendees, Lions President Sean Naughton remarked that the Lion's donation of this marker represents the foundation of our community, with its long history of growth through support of volunteers within the community. The Pocono Lions raises thousands of dollars every year to help those in need within our area.

Scheduled for unveiling on August 1 at 5 p.m. is the marker "Lumbering," which traces the history of the harvesting of our virgin-growth forests during the 1800's. Its location is at Hanna's Farm Market at the corner of Route 940 and Stoney Hollow Road, just west of Pocono Pines. The Monroe County Commissioners donated this historical marker.

In the coming weeks, installation is planned for markers entitled "Lutherland," "Wagner's Tree Farm," "Blakeslee United Methodist Church," and "The Battle of Locust Ridge." These will be followed by "Naomi Pines House," "Sullivan Bridge," "The Stagecoach Inn," "William Henry Christman" and "Jacob Blakeslee, Jr." During the fall many more will be installed.

HATT's annual picnic: "Survival in a Post Ice Age World"

Tracing 11,000 years of human evolution in the Poconos, Clovis people were the earliest inhabitants of the region when they choose a campsite along the Delaware River at Minisink Hills, Monroe County.

At HATT's Annual Picnic on August 11, hear from presenters Nell Fossa and Russ Cramer what a typical post ice age Clovis hunter encampment would have looked like. How did they adapt to survive in that harsh environment? The presentation moves forward in time to the Archaic Period in the Poconos 4,000 years

Enjoy wildflowers at Darling Preserve



The Nature Conservancy invites the public to join guest naturalist Allison Hamilton for a wildflower walk at the Thomas Darling Preserve in Blakeslee on August 21 at 2 p.m.

Walkers will explore the 2,500-acre Thomas Darling Preserve, where they can see a variety of wildflowers and glacial wetlands via a two-mile trail and boardwalk system. Along the way, the leader will point out late summer wildflowers in bloom.

The Darling Preserve hosts two rare plant species as well as one of Pennsylvania's largest native spruce forests and undisturbed peatland system. A small stream, Two Mile Run, emerges from underground springs and seeps, feeding into Tobyhanna Creek on its way to the Lehigh River. The area teems with wildlife typical of the Pocono Plateau, including black bears, river otters, and snowshoe hares. Wildflowers abound, as do blueberry bushes and nesting songbirds.

The walk, free to the public, will take approximately 90 minutes. Please wear sturdy shoes or boots as the trail can be rocky and uneven.

idue and a crack pipe, and screening materials. Both are charged with drug and drug paraphernalia possession, and she for littering.


